Treasurer's Report

The Society has £1177.31 in the bank as well as £96.36 petty cash. Some of this will be needed for stationery and stamps to send out the Chronicles which are still asked for by post.

Last March, the committee agreed to send a donation of £500 to the school to assist with the cost of improving the Sixth Form facilities. It included the raffle proceeds from the Reunion in 2018, together with additional donations from alumnae who generously wanted them to benefit the school. Dr Wilkin acknowledged this with a letter thanking the alumnae and advising that the Sixth Form students would be informed it was from our group.

The Next Annual Reunion is on Sunday 17th May 2020 Our Speaker at the Reunion will be <u>Angela Kilmartin</u> (neé Mendham) Her talk is entitled "Duty - a Burden and a Blessing"



Angela was at the Ursuline between 1945-1958 (she thinks!)

On leaving school, she went to train at the famous Lucie Clayton Modelling Agency and this was followed by five years as an Haute Couture model in Mayfair and the best London fashion houses, in the days when it was highly regarded.

Angela went on from there to train as a professional soprano at the Guildhall School of Music and Drama and there then followed many scholarships and Essex County drama and opera awards. Music is still important to her, as she still actively sings in and around Witham, after a lifetime of high quality classical church music in the City of London - of which she is a Freeman.

Cystitis, for seven terrible years following her 1966 marriage, brought her into researching, writing, lecturing and media work on how to prevent this common condition, and throughout the '70s, '80s and '90s she campaigned on radio, TV and in the media for awareness of this condition and also that of mercury poisoning from teeth fillings. Angela has travelled widely over the years and lived for seven years in Lagos and Jeddah accompanying her then husband and bringing up two children. Angela now resides in Witham where she is a Witham Town Councillor and holds the chairmanships of the town Luncheon Club, the Witham Town History Group and the Witham Town Planning and Transport sub-committee, and - in addition to all of this, she is also currently the Chairman of Braintree District Council, a post she will hold until late-May of this year. We look forward to seeing you at the Annual Reunion. For catering purposes we need to know how many will be attending. Annual Reunion - 2019

held on Sunday, 19 May, 2019 at The Brentwood Ursuline Convent High School

The Chairman welcomed everyone and introduced the Committee members. As usual, everyone was asked to stand up to indicate the decade in which they left school. The 1940s had two representatives, and just one who had left after 2010, but other decades were well represented. Also present were a group of past pupils who were marking 50 years since they all left school.

The Chairman reported that sadly Sheelagh Perkins (neé Pond) had passed away. She was a talented musician and played the piano for the School Song at Annual Reunions. She also spoke about Grace Millane, a former pupil of the school, who had died in New Zealand aged only 22. Please see elsewhere in this Chronicle details of the Silver Bracelets being sold by LL Loves charity in Grace's memory. The Treasurer, Janet Dean, reported the Society had £96.00 in hand, and £1,064.88 in the bank. The Committee has handed the school a cheque for £500, which includes the proceeds from the last four years Annual Reunion Raffles, to use towards a 6th Form project. Contributions to the school are always welcome and the Treasurer explained how contributions can be made.

The Chairman reminded everyone to let the Committee know of any landmark birthdays or other occasions, so a card can be sent to them.

Alumnae membership is now 850 and this year's leavers will add to this number, but there are still many past pupils who are unaware of the Alumnae so please pass the word on. Our Facebook page has 1,309 likes.

Past Pupil Records were available to be picked up as the school is no longer allowed to keep them for more than a certain time.

The Leavers Assembly in May for Year 13 was attended by Marian Mann and Ruth Westrip, who gave information about the Alumnae to the girls. Each student was given a lapel badge.

This year's speaker, **Pat McCarthy (neé Flynn)**, a former pupil of the school, was introduced. Pat was at the Brentwood Ursuline from 1965 until 1972, where she joined her elder sister, Sheila. Pat had a very happy time at school, had a large group of friends, and enjoyed mixing with boarders from all over the world. Following her "O" levels she joined Miss Ring's Secretarial course, and started her career at Redbridge Town Hall.

Sister Gabriel was an inspiration to her as she often asked Pat's opinion about various topics in a very grown up way, and even had the grace to ditch her wild idea that the Sixth Form Review in 1972 (the Belmont production) should be performed in the "natural amphitheatre" down by the lake rather than in the Hall! Pat felt very proud being able to persuade the Headteacher to change her mind! She obtained various qualifications in the Sixth Form and at other educational establishments and when she retired in 2013 was Vice Principal of the Ursuline Academy, Ilford, having taught "A" Level Business Studies and Sociology and R.E. to GCSE.

It is with sadness that we have learned of the passing of the following past pupils:

- Sheelagh Perkins (neé Pond). We were very sorry to hear that Sheelagh Perkins had passed away in June of 2018. She was a very talented all-round musician and was formerly the highly respected head of music at the Ursuline. For many years she was actively involved in local music societies and choirs, as either conductor or accompanist. She regularly attended our Alumnae Annual Reunion, and always played the piano for us, for the School Song.
- Susan Brady (neé Whiting). Susan was at the school between 1970-77. In recent years, she regularly attended the Reunion, and very much enjoyed meeting up with her old schoolmates.

Sadly, Susan passed away in November 2018, after a long and brave battle with cancer.

- Pat Couderay (neé Collinson) born 11 November, 1937, died 1 January, 2020. This sad news came from her good friend Diana Taylor (neé Copeman). Pat worked at the Bank of England, married at age 19 and had five children. She then trained as a teacher and was quickly promoted, finishing her career as Head Teacher of Crays Hill Primary School.
- Sheila Wright (neé Flynn). We have heard the sad news from Sheila's sister, Pat McCarthy, that her sister, Sheila, passed away on 3 October, 2019. There were nine family members at the hospital for her and she is missed by everyone, not least by her husband David. Sheila was tireless in her work for the Church and for Marriage Care. This was acknowledged by the Pope when she was granted the Bene Merenti papal honour. Sheila was at the Ursuline from 1962-1969. She was a keen Sports team member and School Prefect for Belmont (Secretarial). Sheila was Vice Chairman of the Alumnae Society, and a committed and

active member of the Committee. Her contributions will be very much missed. The following was written by Sheila and her husband and is reproduced by kind permission of her husband:
